Why Should We Drop The Law Of Party Statue???

- The Texas LOP (AKA criminal responsibility for the conduct of another) was created in the 1970 legislative session. Weeding the statue during that time fair and just.
- In 1972 the death penalty was abolished in America.
- In 1974 during the legislative session, that statue was changed into the unconstitutional version that is cited today. However, there was nothing here death penalty to apply 7.02b to in 1974.

In 1976 the death penalty was reinstated, therefore cases that were processed under the NEW 7.02 wording (which is unconstitutional) now, by default, handed down the death sentence, though the death penalty didn't exist when the new statue was created. It should be completely rewritten.





Why Should We Drop The Law Of Party Statue???

- The Texas Law of Parties Statue 7.02(b) is worded in the vision of the 1740 slave code of South Carolina, article 17, which permitted slaves to be executed if a slave "attempted to raise insurrection in its Providence," or "entice a slave to run away," or "aid and abett that slave," shall suffer death!

The South Carolina Slave Code reads identical to today's Law of Party Statue and in the vision of this country seeking to dismantle the racism sown and its institutions and neighborhoods, the Law of Parties should be rewritten to reflect fairness and equality.

- slaves must get permission to marry

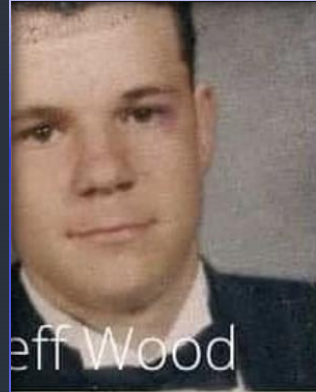


We believe that the criteria of SB1437 should be the standard across America for any person facing a Law of Party charge.





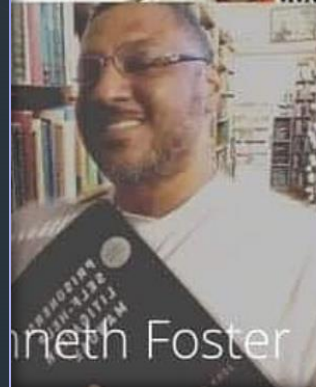
